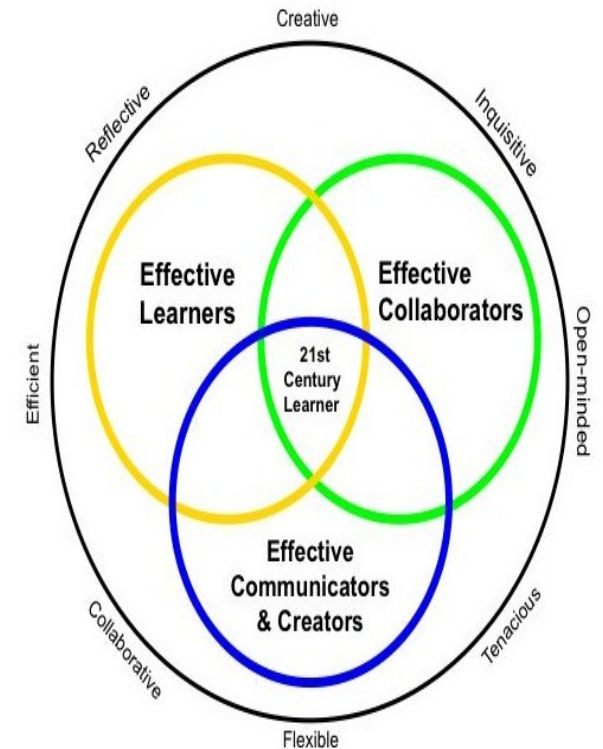

Generates explanations, theories, ideas & solutions

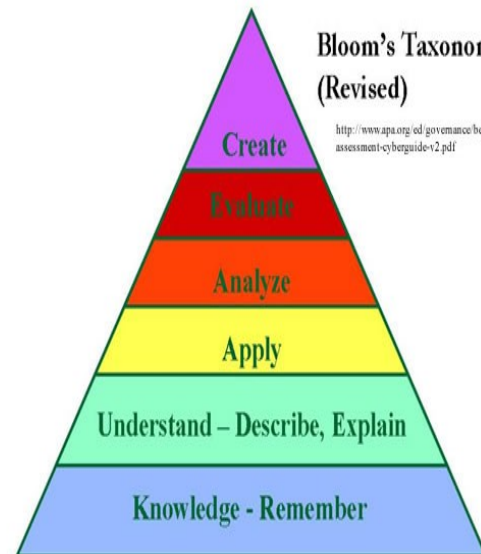
Myths
